

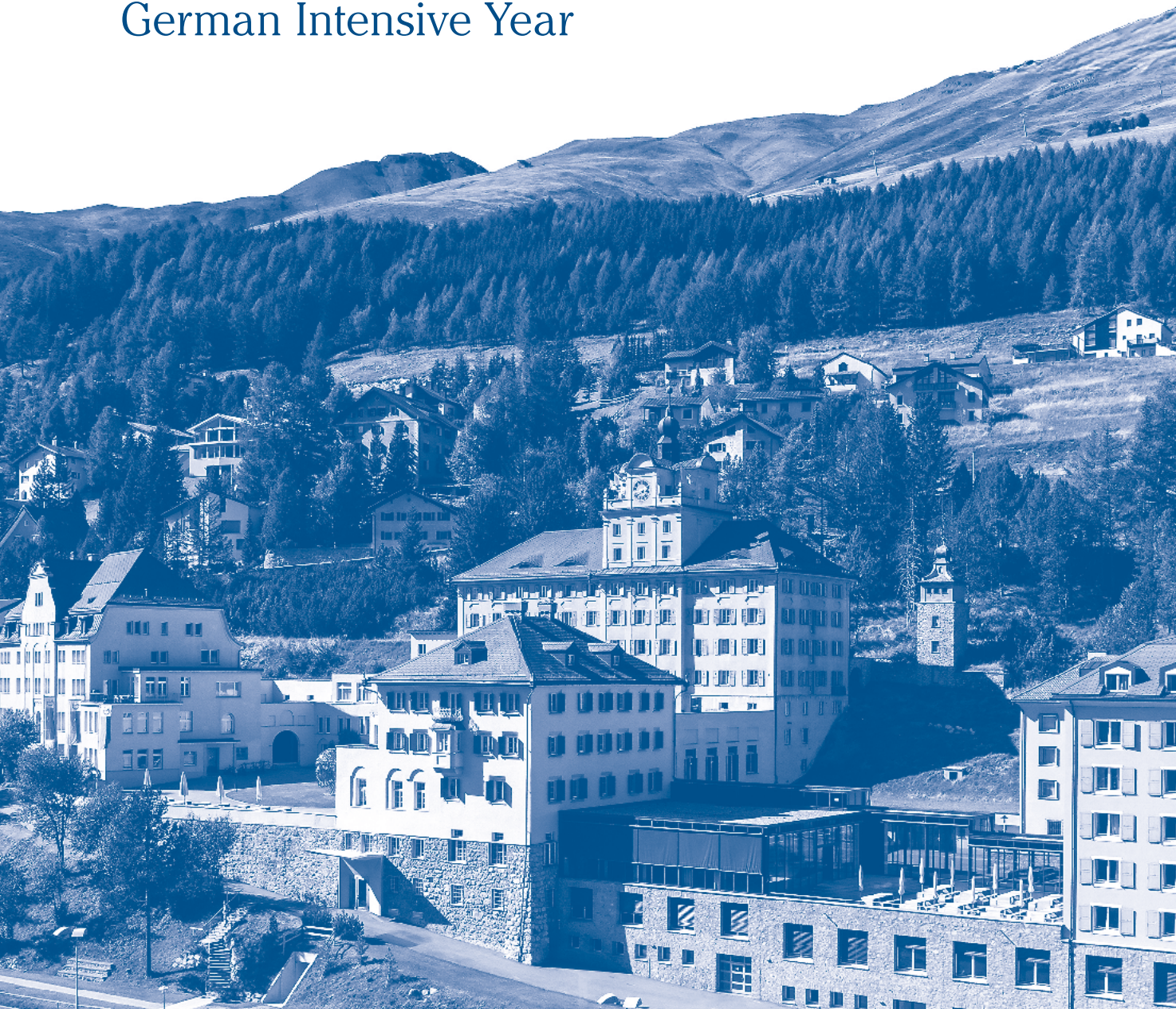

Fee Overview for School Year 2026/2027

One-time costs

The **application fee** is payable upon the submission of an application. This fee is non-refundable regardless of the admissions outcome. The application fee must be paid prior to admissions testing and offer.

The **deposit** reserves a student's place. A non-interest-bearing deposit invoice will be sent with the enrolment contract. This will be credited with the final bill when the student leaves the school.

Sibling Discounts: For families with more than one child enrolled at the Lyceum Alpinum Zuoz at the same time, we are pleased to offer a 10% sibling discount. The full tuition fee is applied to the eldest child, while each additional child receives a 10% reduction on their fees. Please note that this discount is only applicable when two or more children are attending the school simultaneously.

Costs for trips, excursions and journeys will be invoiced with a handling fee of 5% and Value Added tax of 8.1%.

Personalised Learning Coaching: This structured academic support programme is offered to students who would benefit from enhanced, individualised learning strategies. It caters to a broad range of student needs—from managing dyslexia or ADHD to extending learning for high-achievers.

To ensure flexibility and impact, our coaching programme is offered in three tiers based on the level of intervention required. The fees associated with each tier reflect the intensity and frequency of support provided, matched to individual needs of the student. The needs of the student will be reviewed at the end of each semester.

Tier	Level of Support	Annual Fee
Tier 1	Mild Support	CHF 3,000
Tier 2	Moderate Support	CHF 6,000
Tier 3	Intensive Support	CHF 9,000

Tier 1 – Mild Support: For students who need short-term or occasional help, this level provides targeted academic or ESL support in one-on-one or small group settings. Progress is monitored closely, and teachers collaborate to reinforce learning in the classroom.

Tier 2 – Moderate Support: Designed for students who require more regular and structured help, Tier 2 includes ongoing academic or ESL sessions with tailored strategies. Goals are set for each student, and progress is reviewed regularly. Our Learning Support teacher works closely with classroom teachers and parents to ensure consistent support and communication.

Tier 3 – Intensive Support: For students whose needs go beyond classroom differentiation, this level provides frequent, individualized assistance with academic and/or ESL learning. Support involves one-on-one sessions, personalized planning, and continuous tracking of progress. The Learning Support team coordinates closely with classroom teachers and maintains regular communication with parents. Plans are adapted as the student’s needs evolve, within the scope of the school’s resources.

A student’s assigned tier may be adapted at any point during the academic year in response to evolving needs, following a review by the academic team. Any changes to the support level will be made in consultation with and with the approval of the parents or guardians.

Any student requiring support beyond the levels indicated will be quoted a price independent of the above.

Tuition & Fee Payments:

Choosing the right school for your child is an important decision, and we want to make sure our financial conditions are clear and transparent. Please find below an overview of how fees are structured for both returning and new families.

New Families: To confirm and secure a place for your child, new families are asked to complete the following:

- **Application Fee:** Payable when submitting the online application. This must be settled before your child's test and interview.
- **Tuition Fees:** The first semester's tuition and boarding fee are invoiced in March for students commencing their studies in August.
- **Additional Expenses:** Billed in February and July, in the same way as for returning families.
Invoice payments are due within 30 days of receipt of invoice. Full payment is required to guarantee enrolment.

Returning Families: For students who are already enrolled at Lyceum Alpinum Zuoz:

- **Tuition Fees:** Invoices are issued twice a year, in May and December.
- **Additional Expenses:** Billed in February and July.
Full payment of the invoice is due within 30 days of receipt of invoice.

Method of payment: Main costs are invoiced twice annually, in July and December. Additional expenses are payable in February and July. Additional costs will be summarized on the invoice. Upon request a detailed list can be provided.

Payment may only be made by bank transfer to the following bank account. Cash payments will not be accepted.

Enrolment Regulations

New student enrolment:

A student's admission is confirmed once the School Contract has been signed by all parties. If the signed contract is not returned within two weeks, the Lyceum Alpinum Zuoz is no longer bound by the terms of the original offer.

Withdrawal Before School Commencement

- Before 15 May, parents may withdraw without cost, except the Application Fee.
- Withdrawal between 15 May and 15 June: 50% of the Deposit is forfeited.
- After 15 June: 100% of the Deposit is forfeited.

Leaving the School

- Notice must be given in writing by registered post to the Head of School:
 - By 31 October for withdrawal at the end of Semester 1.
 - By 28 February for withdrawal at the end of the school year.
- If notice is late, contractual obligations and costs remain for the following semester.
- Exceptions: Students not promoted may withdraw without notice. Graduating students remain under contract until the end of the school year.

Expulsion

Students may be expelled at any time for disciplinary reasons. In such cases, fees remain payable for the remainder of the semester.

Absences & Premature Departure

- No refund is given for absences (illness, study abroad, etc.), as school place must be retained.
